Library Reorganization Increases Efficiency

Thanks to a grant received during the past year, we were able to make some changes to the Research Library that have greatly increased the efficiency of the facility.

The first and most important change included the replacement of the Library Clerk's desk with a larger L-shaped desk. This created an ergonomically correct work environment while also creating more work space at the same time.

All of the equipment that is used by the Clerk was moved to the desk, including a computer, credit card terminal, etc.

We also changed the sign-in pro-

ceedure when you visit the library. The sign-in book and donation box are located at the Clerk's desk so that all business can be conducted from that location.

In order to fit the new desk into the library, it was necessary to rearrange furniture. The computer workstation was moved out into the middle of the library and other cabinets, tables and equipment were moved. This has resulted in more space for library patrons, volunteers and staff to move around.

A new microfilm reader/printer was purchased for the library to replace some outdated equipment.

This important piece of equipment was purchased with funding provided by our members during the 2008 Annual Appeal.

We are also currently gathering funds to do a large digitization project that will make the use of old newspapers for research much easier

It is with the support of our members and patrons that we are able to complete these projects.

We are continually working to make our research library the best that it can be for everyone involved. If you haven't checked it out, stop by today.

LAQUIN PROGRAM A HUGE SUCCESS

On November 7th, I presented the program, "Laquin: Behind the Photos," at the Rialto Theatre in Canton for the benefit of the Historical Society.

This is the second outreach program that we have done this year. The purpose of such programs is to reach out to communities around Bradford County with educational events in order to get people interested in their local history.

The Rialto Theatre has 154 seats. We estimate that approximately 240 people showed up to fill those 154 seats. Additional chairs were added to increase the capacity.

When the theatre was completely filled, there was still a line going out the door, down the street and around the corner. A quick meeting was held with the theatre staff to determine whether we could fit a second show in for the people that couldn't get in. Thanks to them, we were able to present the program a second time that afternoon for another 40 people who came back. Unfortunately some were not able to attend the second presentation.

The hour and 20 minute program took the audience on a journey through the streets of the town of Laquin. Using over 150 photographs, aerial photography, and maps, the story of Laquin was presented in such a way as to allow people to have a complete understanding of the town, inside and out.

Somewhere around 25 Barclay Mountain books were also sold during the event.

For those who didn't get in, or for those who were unable to attend, we will be scheduling more events for next year in different locations. This time, we will sell tickets in advance so that everyone is guaranteed a seat.

I would like to thank all those who attended the program. We look forward to more of these events in the future.

BCHS HOSTING BRADFORD COUNTY VETERANS HISTORY PROJECT

The Bradford County Historical Society is now housing the office of the Bradford County Veterans History Project. The project is connected to a nationwide effort through the Library of Congress.

According to the website: "The Veterans History Project of the American Folklife Center collects, preserves, and makes accessible the personal accounts of American war veterans so that future generations may hear directly from veterans and better understand the realities of war.

"The Project collects first-hand accounts of U.S. Veterans from the following wars:

- World War I (1914-1920)
- World War II (1939-1946)
- Korean War (1950-1955)
- Vietnam War (1961-1975)
- Persian Gulf War (1990-1995)
- Afghanistan and Iraq conflicts (2001-present)

"In addition, those U.S. citizen civilians who were actively involved in supporting war efforts (such as war industry workers, USO workers, flight instructors, medical volunteers, etc.) are also invited to share their valuable stories.

"The United States Congress created the Veterans History Project in 2000. The authorizing legislation received unanimous support and was signed into law by President William Jefferson Clinton on October 27, 2000."

We are pleased to provide a home for this project.

Research Library to be Closed January through March

The Bradford County Historical Society announces that the Research Library will be closed January through March, 2010. No appointments for research or group tours will be scheduled during this period.

BCHS closed the library last winter as well in an effort to save on utility costs.

As a county historical society, BCHS has relied on a small operations grant from the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission. Due to state budget cuts, the BCHS Board of Trustees expect that little to no funding will be received next year.

Closing the library during the coldest months of the year makes it possible to save dollars for operational costs later in the year. Staff will still be available to answer phone calls, emails and research letters during the three month period.
