In late January 1969 Richard S Edwards deployed to the Western Pacific to operate off Vietnam. She returned to San Diego 13 August 1969, until being decommissioned at Long Beach, Calif. 27 February 1970. She immediately entered Long Beach Naval Shipyard and underwent Anti-Submarine Warfare modernization. By December, she was participating in sea trials in anticipation of her recommissioning, which occurred 15 January 1971. She embarked for March for Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, her new home port, and continued operations in that vicinity until April 1972 when she as sunk for target practice.
