Bicentennial Committee Formed BCHS Plans for Anniversary of Bradford County

The BCHS Board of Trustees have taken the first step in planning for the bicentennial of Bradford County. The bicentennial will begin with 2010 and end in 2012.

According to Henry Farley, Bicentennial Committee Chairman, the county of Ontario was established in 1810 with the present boundaries. On March 24, 1812, the governor approved, among other things, a change of name for the county to Bradford, in honor of former attorney general of the United States, William Bradford.

The committee will discuss

ways to commemorate this event, including a possible new publication by the society.

It is the hope of the society board that others in the county will begin to consider how they may be able to celebrate the bicentennial, which is a few short years away.

Barclay Mountain History Book Deemed A Success

The society released it's newest book, Barclay Mountain - A History, to the public early in December 2007 and are pleased to report that nearly 800 copies have been sold over the past two months.

With 370 pages and over 400 photographs, this history is the most extensive collection of information ever published on the topic of Barclay Mountain.

Tax Assessment Records are being copied, indexed and placed in notebooks in order to help preserve the original documents.

Several of our volunteers are working on answering research queries received from all over the **United States.**

Birth, death and marriage information is being abstracted and filed.

Settler and Sayre Quarterly indexes are being kept up to date.

The photo collection is being organized and inventoried.

A master index is being created for all county cemeteries.

The postcard collection is being organized by town and placed into new archival safe albums.

The 1858 Bradford County map is being indexed.

NOTES FROM THE CURATOR Matt Carl

There is always something new happening at the Bradford County Historical Society! Below are a few highlights of our recent activities.

Wysox IOOF #1152

As I reported at our last annual meeting, the Grand Lodge of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows designated BCHS as the official repository for Bradford County Odd Fellows and Rebekah records on September 26, 2007.

Recently we received another delivery of material from the Wysox IOOF Lodge #1152. The members of the Wysox Lodge are very interested in having these records preserved for future generations and we applied them for their effort and support of BCHS.

Other groups in Bradford County including granges, churches, and clubs are encouraged to consider the future of their own minute books, membership files, etc. The historical society offers a secure and safe repository for these records, ensuring that they will be available for others who are researching their family history for years to come.

County Records

BCHS also received another delivery of material from the Bradford County Courthouse. The delivery included the records of the Bradford County Poor House which later evolved into the Bradford County Manor. These records begin in 1885.

We appreciate the commitment of our county officials who continue to ensure that these records are preserved and easily available to the public.

Historic Monuments

We have been working with the Pennsylvania Historic and Museum Commission to have plaques placed back on two monuments in Bradford County. These are located at Lime Hill on Rt. 6 and at Milan on Rt. 220. This work is now complete and a rededication is being planned for the Lime Hill Monument later this year.

Natural History Exhibit

The Natural History exhibit cell, located on the second floor of the museum, has undergone several changes this winter. Five large photos can now be seen in the cell. These represent the wooly mammoth excavation at Spring Lake in Asylum Township in 1983. We are indebted to Ted Kier for allowing the society to enlarge some of his photos for the exhibit.

In addition to the photos, the 1908 cabinet leaf collection created by past Bradford County Historical Society president, Albert T. Lilley, is again on display. Lilley collected leaves, twigs and wood samples from the forest trees of Bradford County.

Unusual minerals and fossils collected in Bradford County, collages of native mammals and birds, and an owl from 1940 are on display.

Many Improvements Made to Historical Society Building

Many improvements have been made to the Bradford County Historical Society building this winter.

During the end of 2007, a total of 77 engraved signs were mounted throughout the facility. This included 69 cell/room number signs to assist with our Past Perfect inventory and 8 directional signs.

The skylight windows in the

Great Room ceiling have each received UV filters to prevent sunlight from fading items on display in the room.

The largest building project underway at BCHS is the repointing of the Great Room walls, both on the interior and the exterior.
